We are happy that the Master Plan for Connectivity is now adopted, and we hope, our member states will take advantage of the plan, and implement its components to ensure the achievement of our aspiration - for a truly connected Bay of Bengal Region.

To conclude, I wish to express deep gratitude to the Government of Bangladesh for hosting the BIMSTEC Secretariat, extending unstinted support and committing to provide a new modern iconic building for the Secretariat. I also thank Sri Lanka, for hosting the Fifth BIMSTEC Summit this year on 30th March, and the current Chair, Thailand, for guiding us, as BIMSTEC steers forward in its 25th journey - to implement important decisions and directives of our leaders.
