Bangladesh attaches high importance to regional cooperation. It is deeply committed to the goals of the BIMSTEC. Established as a bridge between South and South-East Asia, BIMSTEC agenda capitalizes on the potentials of the region through collective efforts. The grouping started its journey in 1997 with only six identified areas of cooperation, which has expanded to 14 in the subsequent years. Its membership has also increased from 4 to 7 during this period.

BIMSTEC holds enormous potentials for the countries of the region. It provided a strong platform to forge cooperative relations in important areas such as agriculture, trade and

investment, energy, connectivity, food security and climate change. I believe, early implementation of the framework Agreement on BIMSTEC free Trade Area signed in 2004 would pave the way for wider economic cooperation in the region.

Connectivity is another key element for regional integration. Improved connectivity could act as a driving force in transforming BIMSTEC into a vibrant regional grouping.

BIMSTEC can also play a significant role in exploiting the resources of the Bay of Bengal. We have already demonstrated our keen interest in this area by hosting an international Workshop on Blue Economic this month. The BIMSTEC members States could take up bilateral and multilateral initiatives to harness the vast marine resources such as fish, minerals and other resources for sustainable development of the region.

I congratulate Ambassador Sumith Nakandala as the first Secretary general of BIMSTEC. I am confident that he will be able to steer the Organisation in achieving its goals as envisioned by the leaders of the region.
