The signing of the BIMSTEC Agreement on Maritime Transport Cooperation, as well as the MoUs with UNODC and IORA not only demonstrate the growing maturity and relevance of BIMSTEC, but also will strengthen cooperation in areas such as maritime security, disaster risk reduction, countering transnational crime and ensuring sustainable regional trade.

Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Seamless multi-modal connectivity is a precondition for trade and investment promotion and people to people contacts. Energy cooperation is another facilitator for economic development. Bangladesh remains strongly committed to advancing regional economic integration. As the lead country in the Trade, Investment and Development sector, including the Blue Economy Bangladesh has taken meaningful steps to advance this agenda. I am glad to inform that Bangladesh successfully hosted the 3rd Meeting of the BIMSTEC Working Group on Trade Facilitation on 19 March and the 22nd Meeting of the Working Group on Rules of Origin on 25 March 2025.

We hope to receive continued support from our fellow Member States in hosting future meetings and in facilitating the timely finalization of the BIMSTEC Free Trade Area (FTA), which is critical for boosting intra-regional trade, investment flows, and overall economic growth of our region.

Distinguished Guests,

While we celebrate our achievements, we must also acknowledge the challenges ahead. The success of BIMSTEC will ultimately be judged not by the number of agreements signed but by the tangible benefits we deliver to our people. This is a moment for transition—from dialogue to delivery, from vision to implementation.

Bangladesh, as the current BIMSTEC Chair, envisions a BIMSTEC that is functional, visible, and responsive—a forum defined not by rhetoric, but by results. As the host country, I wish to also reaffirm Bangladesh's unwavering support to the BIMSTEC Secretariat. We are committed to ensuring that the Secretariat is well-equipped and empowered to serve the collective interests of all Member States. We expect to commence the construction of an iconic building for the BIMSTEC Secretariat very soon.

Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Let us seize this moment of renewed momentum to shape a future of deeper collaboration and shared prosperity in the Bay of Bengal. With political will, mutual trust, and a shared sense of purpose, BIMSTEC can become a dynamic force for peace, progress, and sustainable development in our region.
