Updates on BIMSTEC Agriculture Cooperation



In the light of emerging issues and challenges confronting the agricultural sector in the BIMSTEC region, be they be the threat of animal diseases, global climatic changes, degrading environment, securing biodiversity and food safety, ensuring free and fair global trade, access to new and emerging technologies and increasing demand for alternative sources of energy, collective and concerted efforts are needed. Myanmar, as a lead country in Agriculture Sector hosted the *1st Expert Group Meeting of BIMSTEC on Agriculture Cooperation* on 15-16 March 2007 at Nay Pyi Taw.

The Meeting was organised in both a Plenary and Bilateral Meetings between Member Countries format. Six areas of Cooperation were identified, namely enhancing the competitiveness of agriculture sector, agricultural research and development, promoting public-private (including cooperatives) partnership for the development of agriculture and agro-processing industries, strengthening socio-economic development in rural community, improving agricultural trade and investment, and developing alternative energy crops.

Cooperation with ADB on Transport and Logistics Project



One of the BIMSTEC projects on transportation and communication sector is the BIMSTEC Transport Infrastructure and Logistics Study undertaken through (BTILS) the Asian Development Bank (ADB) Technical Assistance. The 1st Inception Meeting of the BIMSTEC Technical Advisory Committee of the BTILS was held on 20-21 March 2007 in Bangkok, Thailand. The Meeting was attended by secretaries and senior officials from the respective Transport/Foreign Affairs Ministries of the BIMSTEC member countries and members of BIMSTEC Working

Group in Bangkok. Representatives from BIMSTEC Centre and UNESCAP also attended the Meeting as observers.

The Meeting was held to discuss primarily the initial findings of the Inception Report for this ADB Technical Advisory; to refine the Study's organization and implementation arrangements; and to outline initially the future courses of action for BIMSTEC transport cooperation upon the completion of the study. The priority of the Study is to identify pioneering and forward looking initiatives which should reduce transport bottlenecks and non-tariff barriers which hamper efficient operations and constrained the overall transport system within the region. The Delegates from every member country presented their country papers discussing their local transport infrastructure and services linkages, where common issues were identified and views / recommendations were shared among the participants.

For future plan of action, after finalizing the study report in December 2007, and endorsed in the BIMSTEC Senior Officials' Meeting and/or Ministerial Meeting, the priority projects will be identified and prepared in 2008, and the implementation is expected to commence in 2010.

Trade and Investment Opportunity in India

On 23 March 2007, the Thai Chamber of Commerce and Board of Trade of Thailand in association with Indian Embassy in Bangkok hosted a meeting on "Emerging opportunities between India and Thailand" with focus on North Eastern Region of India at Novotel Lotus Hotel, Bangkok.

The North-East of India, comprising 8 states, is a reservoir of rich natural resources and a beautiful amalgamation of different people and cultures. Apart from an abundance of



resources, this region offers a huge emerging market of 400 million people including the neighbouring countries. Government of India also offers subsidies for the investors on transport, capital investment, interest on the working capital, excise duty refund and income tax exemption. Coinciding with the Chinese New Year Celebration in Nakorn Sawan, a 17 member Sri Lankan group under the patronage of the Ministry of Cultural Affairs and National Heritage of Sri Lanka, presented the rich variety of Sri Lankan music and dance at the festival.

Asia's Grandest Pageant in August 2007

Thousands of Buddhist devotees from around the world, and tourists will converge in August this year to Sri Lanka's ancient Heritage City of Kandy to pay homage to the sacred tooth relic of the Buddha and witness one of Asia's grandest traditional pageants—the glittering Esala Perahera. The main Esala festival takes place during 18—28 August in Kandy, the medieval hill capital of Sri Lanka. The glittering Kandy Esala Perahera, parades the streets for ten nights by moon and torch light, in the lake-side mountain citadel.





While the roots of Esala festivals go deep into Sri Lanka's early history, Kandy's Esala Perahera in its present form dates from 1775. The pageant's centre-piece is a majestic, richly caparisoned, tusked elephant, bearing a replica of the relic casket. Large crowds of visitors and devotees, bazaars overflowing with fruits, handicrafts, sweetmeats and souvenirs give Kandy a carnival atmosphere at this time. The climax of the festival is the final night (Esala Full Moon), when the pageant is at its grandest. It ends with the day-time perahera the next morning and the water-cutting ceremony in the Mahaweli river, a ritual symbolizing the triumph of good over evil and to ensure rain in the season and other blessings.
