The Seventeenth BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting

The Seventeenth BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting was convened virtually in Colombo, Sri Lanka on 01 April **2021** to finalize preparations for the Fifth BIMSTEC Summit to be held in Colombo, Sri Lanka.

The Seventeenth BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting was attended by His Excellency Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, M.P., Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh; His Excellency Lyonpo (Dr.) Tandi Dorji, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Royal Government of Bhutan; His Excellency Dr. Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister of the Government of the Republic of India; His Excellency Mr. Ko Ko Hlaing, Union Minister for International Cooperation of the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar; His Excellency Mr. Pradeep Kumar Gyawali, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Government of Nepal; His Excellency Mr. Tharaka Balasuriya, State Minister of Regional Co-operation of the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka; and His Excellency Mr. Don Pramudwinai, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand and their respective delegations.

The Ministers noted with appreciation the extensive measures taken by the Governments of the BIMSTEC Member States in responding and supporting Member States to face the challenges posed by the COVID 19 pandemic at the national level, including providing COVID vaccines. They also encouraged the Member States to continue to support one another in the post-COVID-19 recovery and rehabilitation either through BIMSTEC framework or bilaterally, as appropriate, to foster the spirit of BIMSTEC solidarity.

They expressed their resolve to further mobilize all relevant Sectors and Sub-sectors of cooperation to strengthen economic and physical connectivity to enhance regional trade, investment, tourism, technology, energy and other forms of exchanges, including to offset the economic losses caused by the pandemic.

They resolved to mobilize all relevant Sectors and Sub-sectors of cooperation to strengthen the collective resilience to combat the challenges of poverty, natural disasters, climate change, pandemics and other public health emergencies, terrorism and transnational crimes, and food and energy security through partnership and joint actions, in harmony with the national implementation to achieve 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, keeping in mind that COVID-19 may not be the last calamity to befall our region.



They expressed deep appreciation to the Member States who have completed the internal procedures of the draft text of the BIMSTEC Charter and recommended the remaining Member States to complete their internal procedures for adoption of the BIMSTEC Charter at the BIMSTEC Summit.

The Ministers stressed the need to develop a resilient regional transport connectivity system capable of withstanding future disruptions with an enhanced focus on the development of coastal shipping, waterways and railways, road connections, and air cargo operation. They also expressed deep appreciation to the Member States for submitting the finalized draft of the **BIMSTEC Master Plan for Transport Connectivity**, and recommended it to the Fifth BIMSTEC Summit for adoption.

In addition, they agreed to recommend the signing of the following legal instruments during the Fifth BIMSTEC Summit:

- 1. BIMSTEC Convention on Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters;
- Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Mutual Cooperation between Diplomatic Academies/Training Institutions of BIMSTEC Member States; and
- Memorandum of Association on the Establishment of BIMSTEC Technology Transfer Facility (TTF) in Colombo, Sri Lanka.

The Ministers also noted the progress in the various sectors of cooperation and committed to further intensify their efforts to implement the directives given by the Leaders at the Fourth BIMSTEC Summit.

77th Session of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UN-ESCAP): "Building back better from crises through regional cooperation in Asia and the Pacific" on 26-29 April 2021(Virtual)



In his address at the 77th Session of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UN-ESCAP):"Building back better from crises through regional cooperation in Asia and the Pacific", the Secretary General of BIMSTEC stressed on the importance of collaboration and cooperation in building back better. He also underscored the important role that technology plays in times of crisis such as the present one and highlighted the need for pooling of resources and expertise. He urged the countries to work together in the fight against the current pandemic for the benefit of all humanity.

First Meeting of the BIMSTEC Grid Interconnection Coordination Committee



The **First Meeting of the BIMSTEC Grid Interconnection Coordination Committee (1**st BGICC) was held virtually in Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar on 30 June 2021. Delegations from all BIMSTEC Member States including the Designated National Representatives to constitute the BGICC attended the Meeting.

The Meeting was inaugurated by His Excellency Mr. Than Zaw, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Electricity and Energy of Myanmar. His Excellency Mr. Tenzin Lekphell, Secretary General of BIMSTEC delivered the Special Remarks at the opening session. The Meeting thanked Myanmar, the Lead Country of BIMSTEC Energy Cooperation, for taking an initiative to host the 1st BGICC Meeting.

At the Meeting, the Members of BGICC discussed their functions and mandate as mentioned in the **MOU for Establishment of the BIMSTEC Grid Interconnection** and **TOR of the BGICC.** The BGICC Members are mandated to coordinate implementation of grid interconnections and trade in electricity. The BGICC Members also shared their views on the "Way Forward of the BGICC" and deliberated on how to undertake the **BIMSTEC Grid Interconnection Master Plan Study (BGIMPS)** among others.

The Meeting also touched on the importance of formulating a **BIMSTEC Policy for Transmission of Electricity** and a **BIMSTEC Policy for Trade, Exchange of Electricity and Tariff Mechanism** in accordance with the TOR of the BGICC.

In his Special Remarks, the Secretary General of BIMSTEC highlighted the importance of holding meetings of BIMSTEC Sectoral Cooperation regularly and expressed his conviction to have renewed commitment from the Member States on the holding of the **Third BIMSTEC Energy Ministers' Meeting (3rd BEMM)** and the **Fifth Senior Officials' Meeting on Energy (5th SOM-E)** respectively in due course.
