Secretary General calls on Prime Minister of Bangladesh



The Secretary General(SG) Ambassador Indra Mani Pandey called on H. E. Sheikh Hasina, Honourable Prime Minister of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh at the latter's Office on 13 February 2024. SG was accompanied by his spouse Mrs. Sushma Pandey.

SG congratulated Honourable Prime Minister on her historic re-appointment as the Prime Minister of Bangladesh for the 4th consecutive term and commended the exemplary progress that Bangladesh has achieved under her able leadership. He wished her success in all her endeavours to realize the goal of a developed, prosperous and smart Bangladesh by 2041.

SG apprised Honourable Prime Minister of the achievements made in strengthening regional cooperation through BIMSTEC since the 5th BIMSTEC Summit held in Colombo, Sri Lanka in 2022. SG also thanked the Government of Bangladesh for hosting the BIMSTEC Secretariat in Dhaka and providing it with the requisite support in enabling it to fulfill its responsibilities.

SG sought the Leadership of Bangladesh, as the Lead Country for regional cooperation in Trade, Investment & Development Sector under BIMSTEC, to work closely with other member States to expedite conclusion of negotiations of the six constituent Agreements under BIMSTEC Free Trade Area Agreement. He requested Honourable Prime Minister's indulgence in expeditious completion of the project to construct an Iconic building for housing the BIMSTEC Secretariat.

Hobourable Prime Minister, referring to the abiding commitment of Bangladesh to BIMSTEC, as one of its founding members, assured SG of her Government's support in realizing the goal of regional cooperation in Bay of Bengal region through BIMSTEC, particularly sustainable development, which is a shared goal of all the BIMSTEC member States.

Hon'ble Prime Minister also assured that the new building for BIMSTEC will be completed in the next three years. She shared her Government's priorities and people-centric policies focused on realization of the goal of sustainable development of Bangladesh including rural development. Stating that the people's support to her is her only source of strength and she reiterated her abiding commitment to democracy in Bangladesh.

Secretary General calls on State Minister for Commerce of Bangladesh



The Secretary General Ambassador Indra Mani Pandey, called on H.E. Ahasanul Islam (Titu), MP, Honourable State Minister for Commerce of Bangladesh on 05 February 2024 at the latter' office in Dhaka, Bangladesh.

Secretary General congratulated H.E. Ahasanul Islam on his appointment as the State Minister for Commerce and apprised him of the progress being made in fostering regional cooperation within the BIMSTEC framework, especially in Trade, Investment and Development Sector, which is led by Bangladesh. The Secretary General also thanked the Ministry of Commerce for its support in leading cooperation in the vital domains of trade and investment.

Hon'ble Minister and the Secretary General underscored the importance of making swift progress in the negotiations under the Framework Agreement on BIMSTEC Free Trade Area Agreement, which will contribute to more trade and investment within the region and help in realization of sustainable development in BIMSTEC member States. They also stressed on the importance of forging cooperation in digital commerce and promotion of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises among the member States.

BIMSTEC Aquatics Championship 2024



The first ever BIMSTEC Aquatics Championship was held at the Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee Swimming Pool Complex with a grand inauguration ceremony in New Delhi, India from 06-09 February, 2024. Shri Anurag Singh Thakur, Honourable Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports of India, in esteemed presence of Shri Dig Bahadur Limbu, Honourable Minister of Youth & Sports of Nepal, inaugurated the championship.

At the opening, the Secretary General Ambassador Indra Mani Pandey expressed his gratitude to the Government of India for hosting the Championship and underscored the significance of organizing such sports and other youth events in fostering regional cooperation in the Bay of Bengal region.

The championship was also the first sports event being organized within the BIMSTEC framework and over 400 athletes and officials from seven BIMSTEC member States participated in the championship, which included 43 events across 3 aquatic disciplines of swimming, diving and water polo.

The event concluded successfully and has been significant in further enhancing the public recognition of BIMSTEC, especially amongst the youth.

Secretary General at 7th Indian Ocean Conference 2024



The Secretary General Ambassador Indra Mani Pandey attended the 7th Indian Ocean Conference 2024 held from 09-10 February in Perth, Australia and also participated as a Panelist at the **Panel Discussion on Strengthening ties in the Indian Ocean**: *How can we better facilitate cooperation through regional architecture, between Indian Ocean countries?*

During the panel discussion, the Secretary General spoke on the importance of regional cooperation in dealing with security and development challenges in the Indian Ocean Region(IOR) and mentioned that regional organizations, including BIMSTEC do provide a viable framework for forging multifaceted cooperation in IOR.

Further, the Secretary General mentioned that, given the commitment of member States, BIMSTEC is poised to play a leading role in the security and sustainable development of the Bay of Bengal region and has a huge untapped potential which can contribute to the security and growth in the entire IOR.

The Secretary General also underscored the importance of strengthening cooperation in the Bay of Bengal region through the framework of BIMSTEC and stated that BIMSTEC should be an integral part of any strategy or mechanism to promote security and development in IOR.

Discussion on Research on Traditional Medicine Used in COVID-19 and Diabetes



The Expert Group constituted to conduct a systematic review of research on traditional medicine used in COVID-19 and Diabetes, as per the BIMSTEC Plan of Action on Development of Traditional Medicine, held a virtual meeting on 13 February 2024.

During the Meeting, the Experts from the BIMSTEC member States held detailed discussions on research methodologies for conducting systematic reviews of research on

traditional medicine used in COVID-19 and Diabetes, and decided that they would work together to prepare, register, and publish Protocols for this purpose, in scientific journals.

The meeting also decided that individual member States would publish their completed systematic reviews of research in scientific journals. India and Sri Lanka serve as the lead countries for this activity relating to the systematic reviews of research in COVID-19 and Diabetes respectively.

International Seminar on Economic Diversification and Global Market

BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting

The BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting comprises Ministers dealing with foreign relations of the member States and meets annually, preceded by the BIMSTEC Senior Officials' Meeting. So far, 19 Ministerial Meetings were held and the meeting is being hosted by the member State holding the BIMSTEC Chairmanship.

The BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting, among others, coordinates overall BIMSTEC cooperation and the implementation of agreements & decisions of the BIMSTEC Summit; endorses the deliberations of the BIMSTEC Sectoral Ministerial Meetings; and approves budget of the Secretariat and BIMSTEC Centres/Entities as proposed by the Senior Officials' Meeting.
