Editorial



Welcome to our second Monthly BIMSTEC E-Newsletter of 2025!

The month of February 2025 began with my visit to Sri Lanka. My engagements with Sri Lanka's leadership underscored the importance of collaboration in Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI), health and human resource development, including Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) under the BIMSTEC framework. Sri Lanka's steadfast commitment to BIMSTEC aligns with the enduring commitment of other BIMSTEC member States, providing a solid basis for deeper regional cooperation and integration.

While the 8th Meeting of BIMSTEC Permanent Working Committee (BPWC) discussed the matters pertaining to 6th BIMSTEC Summit as well as administrative and financial matters, the 3rd Meeting of the BIMSTEC Network of Tour Operators discussed, inter alia, the operational modalities for BIMSTEC Buddhist Circuits & BIMSTEC Cruise Circuits.

The inaugural BIMSTEC Youth Summit and BIMSTEC Youth for Climate Action Conference 2025 held in India further underscored the critical role that Youth must play in advancing regional cooperation. While the BIMSTEC Digital Conclave 2025, themed "Building Digital Public Infrastructure for Shared Prosperity," brought together leaders and experts to discuss regional cooperation in developing DPI for digital transformation and development, the workshop on Emerging Anti-Money Laundering and Counter Financing of Terrorism emphasized the need for regional collaboration to address the evolving threats and regulatory challenges in combating money laundering and terrorist financing across the region.

I was honored to speak at the Plenary Session on "Navigating New Frontiers: Evolving Maritime Landscape in the 21st Century" at the 8th Indian Ocean Conference 2025. The IOC 2025 also provided a valuable platform to engage various stakeholders in security and development of Indian Ocean Region, including Ministerial and Senior Delegates of the BIMSTEC member States, on the goals, priorities and challenges of BIMSTEC. I also had the opportunity during the month to call on Honourable Minister of Sports and Youth Affairs of India and Honourable Principal Secretary to Prime Minister of India, as well as a member of Secretaries to the Government of India. During the month, I was privileged to meet with heads of regional & international organisations and members of Diplomatic Correspondents Association of Bangladesh, enhancing BIMSTEC' outreach and partnerships.

Secretary General's Engagements

Secretary General Visits Sri Lanka



SG undertook an official visit to Sri Lanka from February 5-7, 2025. During the visit, SG called on H.E. Dr. Harini Amarasuriya, Hon'ble Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, who reaffirmed Sri Lanka's steadfast commitment to BIMSTEC and emphasized the critical importance of strengthening collaboration in Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI) as well as Health and Human Resource Development Sectors under the BIMSTEC framework. SG commended the Government of Sri Lanka for its leadership in advancing regional cooperation through BIMSTEC.

SG also called on with H.E. Vijitha Herath, Hon'ble Minister of Foreign Affairs, Foreign Employment & Tourism, to discuss Sri Lanka's priorities and its pivotal role in driving regional cooperation through BIMSTEC. SG also called on H.E. Nalinda Jayatissa, Hon'ble Minister of Health & Mass Media, to explore avenues for expanding collaboration in Health Sector as well as H.E. During the visit, SG delivered a keynote address at the BIMSTEC Digital Conclave, organized by The Asia Group in collaboration with the BIMSTEC Secretariat and with support of the Government of Sri Lanka. SG underscored the significance of the Conclave in advancing regional digital transformation through building DPIs and highlighted BIMSTEC's achievements, goals and challenges in fostering regional and other cooperation in digital domains.

The visit underscored BIMSTEC's commitment to strengthening regional cooperation and leveraging collective efforts of the member States to address their shared challenges. SG expressed his gratitude to the Government of Sri Lanka for its warm hospitality and reiterated BIMSTEC's dedication to achieving security and inclusive and sustainable development of the BIMSTEC member States.

Secretary General Calls on Foreign Minister of Nepal





Workshop on Emerging Anti-Money Laundering & Counter Financing of Terrorism Trends and Typologies of BIMSTEC Member States

Delegates from BIMSTEC member States engaged in in-depth discussions on evolving threats and regulatory challenges, while emphasizing the critical need for regional collaboration to effectively combat money laundering and terrorist financing.

It featured discussions on digital identity, payments, health, SME Transformation, logistics and governance. It provided a valuable platform for sharing experiences and forging partnerships to amplify the impact of DPI initiatives in the BIMSTEC member States.


First BIMSTEC Youth Summit 2025

It was organized by Department of Youth Affairs, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India and it saw participation of 70 youth delegates from the BIMSTEC member States, fostering dialogue and collaboration among young leaders.
